Dear Friends

In *The Christ of the Indian Road*, a book written by the great Methodist missionary Eli Stanley Jones in 1925, he records how, in one of his many conversations with Ghandi, he asked him what would be the best way to contextualise Christianity in India. In response, Ghandi said, "I would suggest first of all that all of you Christians...begin to live more like Jesus Christ".

Despite all the advances in science, medicine, technology, social care and human rights, we only have to look around us, or read the latest news stories, to see that we live in a broken world. The range of problems both in this country and around the world seem bigger than ever. Yet what if all the social, political and technological problems we are experiencing are connected to the same root cause? What if Oswald J. Smith, the Canadian Church Leader, was right when he said: "The heart of the human problem is the problem of the human heart"? Could it be that a truthful yet challenging diagnosis would tell us that a change in our lifestyles would make all the difference?

Living in a society that spends much of its time considering well-being and lifestyle choices, is not one of the challenges for the Christian Church to equip and enable its members to *live* out their faith? To demonstrate to others the difference faith makes, something we have really enjoyed doing this week at Lighthouse! Thankfully, in this Sunday's reading from Paul's letter to the Ephesians, he addresses this issue by referring to the four great characteristics of a Christian life – humility, gentleness, patience and love. He reminds us that there is hope if we listen to this diagnosis, personally apply his prescription of living more Christ-like lives, and adjust our lifestyles accordingly.

May we be a voice and not just an echo!
